## *From the Pastor's Desk*

This weekend our Church celebrates the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. Our God loves us so much that He literally gives His very flesh and blood to us under the appearance of ordinary bread and wine. This is why we say "Amen" whenever we receive the Eucharist. The word *Amen* means, "I believe." So, when the minister presents the host to us and says, "The Body of Christ," we respond "Amen" to signify our belief that we are receiving God Himself under sacramental signs. Perhaps that is something to reflect on this week, because it truly is a great mystery. If you tend to walk out the door as soon as you receive Communion at Mass, I invite you to stop, return to your pew, kneel down and pray. Think about the amazing gift that you have just received, and think about the price that Jesus paid (His Passion, Death and Resurrection) to give you that gift. It is certainly something to reflect on, and it's more important than anything we have to rush out for after Mass. And to highlight this solemnity, we will have a Corpus Christi procession with the Eucharist after the 5pm Saturday Mass this weekend.

But even though we celebrate a special feast today, and it is signified by the color white (which is used for feast days of the Lord), we are actually in the season of Ordinary Time. You can see this from the green banners in church. In the liturgical calendar, the color green highlights God's creation, reminding us that God is present to us at all times and in all places. Ordinary Time is by far the longest season of the year; it lasts for a total of 34 weeks. This season will carry us to the end of the Church year at the end of November.

But in the secular calendar, of course, we are heading into the summer season. This means it is time for me to give my usual summer reminder. As I hope you know by now (and you know this if you look at the presider schedule in the bulletin each week), for the majority of the year I take all four weekend Masses. I do this not only to save us money on paying visiting priests, but I also do it so that I can take some time in the summer to participate in my favorite activity: competing in triathlons (a swim, bike, and run race). Unfortunately, virtually all triathlons take place on Sundays. Consequently, I take most of the Masses for most of the year so that I can take a little time during the summer to compete in these races.

This weekend is my first tri of the summer. So, as with most of my race weekends, I will be here for the Saturday confessions and 5pm Mass, but I won't be here on Sunday because of the race. I do have several races this summer, so on most of those weekends you'll see me at the 5pm, but not at the Sunday Masses. And I want to publicly thank Fr. Dan Flens and Fr. Bob Flack, who will generously be covering most of my "race Masses" this summer.

And just to clarify (because I know that some people are thinking it) – no, I am not doing several half-Ironman races this summer. A half-Ironman is only one type of triathlon. There are four different distances in triathlon; a half-Ironman is one of the longer distances, but most triathletes (like me) do mostly Sprint and Olympic distances because they are more manageable and easier to recover from. This is what my summer races consist of.

However, one of my upcoming races this summer will be a very special one because it will mark a big achievement for me...but I'll say more about that next week!

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

The origins of today's solemnity lie in thirteenth-century Belgium. In those days, people seldom received Holy Communion, and never from the chalice. A nun in a troubled convent, Juliana of Liège, devoted her life to stirring up love for the Eucharist, lobbying for a feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament with Masses and processions.

Juliana may have been inspired by the Ascension Day processions in nearby Bruges. Crusaders brought a treasure home to Bruges from Constantinople in 1204: a reliquary said to contain a cloth from Joseph of Arimathea with which he had helped prepare the body of Jesus for burial. The stain on the cloth was said to be the holy blood itself, and so the people of Bruges built a great basilica to house the relic. Bruges became a great center of pilgrimage because of this treasure, and the procession of the Holy Blood is still one of the greatest festivals in Belgium today. The bishop carries the relic through the narrow streets, and the people wear medieval costumes and act out scenes from the Bible.

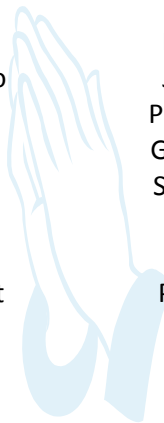

Registration is now open for the 2018 - 2019 year!

You DO NOT need to be a parishioner of St. Beatrice to enroll your child in the Religious Education Program.

To enroll your child in the Religious Education Program you will need the following:

- A copy of your child's 1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation and Communion certificates, if applicable.

## About Our Program

Our Religious Education classes meet every other Saturday from 9 – 11:30am.

Our First Class is September 22<sup>nd</sup>.

We are committed to giving our students the tools they need to grow and mature in their faith by:

- Gathering for prayer every class*
- Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent & Lent*
- Encouraging faithful discipleship through the completion of Mass and service hours*
- Through enrichment opportunities during the year like Living Stations of the Cross and the Seder Meal*
- Offering opportunities for involvement in parish ministries like Altar Serving & student choir.*

Our program invites the whole family to grow more in their faith by attending our monthly family Masses and any other activities we offer during the year.

## Sacramental Information

The Religious Education program has a 2 year consecutive attendance requirement for the reception of the Sacraments of Communion and Confirmation.

1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation & Communion are usually celebrated in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and Confirmation is celebrated in 8<sup>th</sup> Grade.

Students in grades 3-7 who need to receive the sacraments of 1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation & Communion will be enrolled in ***Special Sacraments Class*** in their second consecutive year of attendance in the Religious Education Program. This class is designed to be a separate class to prepare the students for these sacraments. This class meets on a separate Saturday each month from 9-11am.
