## *From the Pastor's Desk*

I had a lot of “thank-you’s” to convey in last week’s article, so I was not able to talk about the change in liturgical seasons. We have returned to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. We first began Ordinary Time after the Christmas season ended, but then it was put on hold when Lent began. Once the Easter season concluded on June 4<sup>th</sup>, we returned to Ordinary Time, which will now take us through to the end of this liturgical year, all the way until Advent at the beginning of December.

To correspond to this season, the banners behind our altar have changed to green, which is the liturgical color of Ordinary Time, highlighting the fact that God is revealed to us in all creation, and in the ordinary aspects of life all around us. And because there is no one specific mystery that we focus on in this season (like Jesus’ birth or His resurrection), the images on our banners are more general. They are images of the two essential parts of the Mass: the Liturgy of the Word (the left banner) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (the right banner).

But even though the color for this season is green, the color for this particular Sunday is white, just as it was for last Sunday. That is because last Sunday was the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and this Sunday is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, also known as the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Whenever the feast of Corpus Christi comes around, I find that you can never do too much teaching on the Eucharist, because unfortunately many Catholics have misunderstandings about what our Church actually believes about the Eucharist.

Let me give a simple but clear illustration about what the Eucharist actually is. Whenever I train new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, I always present a scenario to them, and I’d like to present it here to you too: What should we do if we run out of hosts during Communion time at Mass? What if all four ministers run out, and there are no hosts left in the tabernacle? Can we run back to the sacristy (where the Mass supplies are kept), open a jar of hosts, fill the ciboria with those hosts, and bring them out to distribute to the people? Would that be an acceptable solution?

Hopefully you answered no, but I know from experience that many Catholics would answer yes; they would see no problem with this. But there is a problem with that scenario – a big problem. The hosts sitting in the jars in the sacristy have not yet been consecrated. They have not yet been placed on the altar and consecrated during the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass. Therefore, they are nothing more than hosts. They are ordinary bread. They can be thrown out, stepped on, tossed aside – it doesn’t matter, because they are ordinary bread, and not the Body of Christ.

But once those same hosts are consecrated at Mass, they are no longer ordinary bread. They have become the actual Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. That means that we cannot throw them out, toss them aside, or treat them with anything but the utmost respect. That is because the Real Presence of Christ is revealed and given to us under the appearance of bread and wine. The bread and wine that are consecrated at Mass are *substantially* changed – they are truly no longer bread and wine. What a monumental gift this is that God gives us: the Creator of the universe loved us, His creation, so much that he deigned to give us His very self. That great mystery is something to reflect on as we celebrate Corpus Christi. Let us also reflect on the fact that when the Communion ministers say to us, “The Body of Christ,” they truly mean it!

Finally, I would like to wish a Happy Father’s Day to all fathers out there. May your love always reflect the love that our Heavenly Father has for all His children.

Registration is now open for the 2017 - 2018 year!

You **DO NOT** need to be a parishioner of St. Beatrice to enroll your child in the Religious Education Program.

## About Our Program

Our Religious Education classes meet every other Saturday from 9 – 11:30am.

Our 1<sup>st</sup> Class is September 9<sup>th</sup>.

We are committed to giving our students the tools they need to grow and mature in their faith by:

- Gathering for prayer every class
- Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent & Lent
- Encouraging faithful discipleship through the completion of Mass and service hours
- Through enrichment opportunities during the year like Living Stations of the Cross and the Seder Meal
- Offering opportunities for involvement in parish ministries like Altar Serving & student choir.

Our program invites the whole family to grow more in their faith by attending our monthly family Masses and any other activities we offer during the year.

## Sacramental Information

The Religious Education program has a 2 year consecutive attendance requirement for the reception of the Sacraments of Communion and Confirmation.

1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation & Communion are usually celebrated in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and Confirmation is celebrated in 8<sup>th</sup> Grade.

Students in grades 3-7 who need to receive the sacraments of 1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation & Communion will be enrolled in **Special Sacraments Class** in their 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive year of attendance in the Religious Education Program. This class is designed to be a separate class to prepare the students for these sacraments. This class meets on a separate Saturday each month from 9-11am.
